Curry paste. To practice speaking. To listen not only to TOEFL or TOEIC but also to the conversation, for example, to listen to the movie or the American TV show on youtube.


The first week is held in suburb area Emmental. And the second and third week is held in Zurich. In the first week, we took mainly class and learned " what is health or what is quality of life". You don't have to study so much in this program it takes less than one hour to prepare or review the class. However, you have to contribute to the group.

The program was mainly consisting of group work. So, you need to speak a lot. You had better practice speaking your own opinion in the way of discussion or presentation.

I could understand almost all lectures, but sometimes it was difficult to listen to conversation in daily life. It was also difficult to speak English in discussion. Generally, in Switzerland, everyone uses English as a second language. This is helpful or easy for Japanese to understand. As an advice, you had better listen not only to TOEFL but also to some Movie or TV show and you had better speak English a lot.
