Prof. Coutinho has a bachelor's degree in Economics from the University of São Paulo (Brazil) and a Master's and PhD degrees in Economics from Cornell University (USA). He held visiting professor positions at the University of São Paulo, University of Texas, University of Paris XIII and the Institute Ortega y Gasset (Madrid, Spain) and was a full professor of economics at the University of Campinas/UNICAMP. Between 1985 and 1988, he served as Deputy-Minister of the newly created Ministry of Science and Technology. He became founding dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania in 1974 and later became its twenty-third provost. Prof. Hilmer was the President and eighth Vice-Chancellor of the University of New South Wales (UNSW).
